2 UPCOMING EVENTS

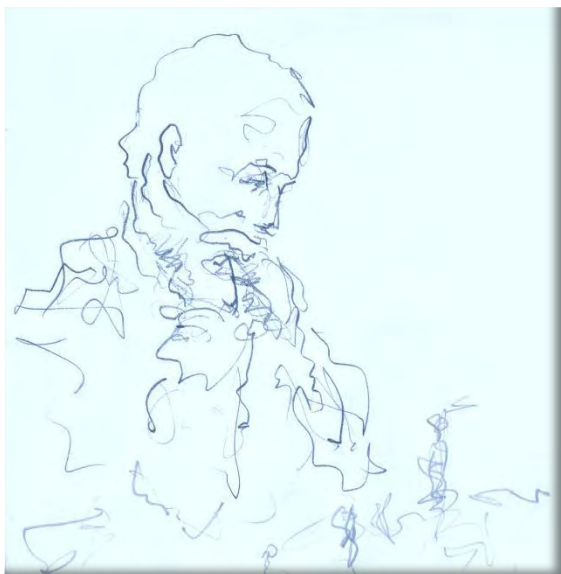

5 GAMES SECTION

More Suncoast Open games this month, but featuring only Suncoast players.

D'Arcy, Michael (1187) – Krause, Terry (1609) [B19]

Suncoast Open Coolum Beach RSL (6.7), 23.05.2010

1.e4 c6 2.d4 d5 3.Nc3 dxe4 4.Nxe4 Bf5 5.Ng3 Bg6 6.h4 h6 7.Nf3 Nd7 8.h5 Bh7 9.Bd3 Bxd3 10.Qxd3 Ngf6 11.Bd2 e6 12.0-0-0 Qc7 13.Rhe1? I'm still not sure about this [Ed: You're right, it's not well regarded, normal is 13.Ne4 ; or 13.Qe2] **13...Bd6** [Terry felt this was inaccurate, suggesting instead 13...Be7 as white gets some decent piece activity for the pawn. I think 13...0-0-0 might be better, getting the king off the e-file and threatening ...Bd6, when the h5 pawn is looking quite delicate and white no longer has Nf5. (Ed: Castling has been played more regularly)] **14.Nf5 Nxe5**



15.g3N [Ed: 15.g4 0-0-0 16.Nxd6+ Qxd6 17.gxh5 1-0 Tatarczak, J–Cherpin, E Noordwijkerhout 1980]

15...0-0-0 [Ed: 15...Bf8!?] **16.Nxd6+ Qxd6 17.Qe2 Qc7 18.Ne5 Nxe5 19.dxe5 g6 20.g4 Ng7 21.Qe3 b6 22.Qf3 h5 23.Qf6 Rhg8 24.Bg5 Rxd1+ 25.Rxd1 hxd4** White is now temporarily a second pawn down, but his grip on the dark squares compensates for this **26.Qf4 Nf5** [Ed: Δ26...Nh5 27.Qe3 Rh8 28.Rg1 Ng7! 29.Rxd4 Rh1+ 30.Kd2 Nf5 and Black's position looks fun!] **27.Bf6!** It is important not to let the black rook escape **27...c5 28.Qxd4 Qc6 29.c3 Rf8** White has the more active pieces, but Black has the weak squares covered and neither Terry nor I could find a way for white to do anything special in the post-game analysis. ½-½

In our second game, an early middle-game oversight puts paid to Finn Sorenson's second round chances in this year's Suncoast Open.
